- 1. Practise ladder safety by having a buddy, placing ladders on level spaces, and securing the ladders;
- Check outdoor cords that may have frayed or been damaged during winter;
- 3. Ensure equipment is properly fueled to eliminate inhalation risk;
- 4. If digging, contact Ontario One Call to locate buried cables, pipes and wires;
- 5. Stretch and warm up before beginning to work.

- For clarity and readability, the 15-page Table 1 will be moved to the end of the standard
- Verbiage for ride-specific standards from a design standpoint
- Summary ordering of clauses in F770 for Section 9 versus Section 11
- Adding ride-specific standards that are under the F24 umbrella
- Verbiage for welding

- A. Tanzer said the high cost of airline travel restricts him from attending in person.
- A. Campbell asked if having an in-person meeting once a year with an expanded agenda would be doable. A. Tanzer said it would depend on what is on the agenda.
- A. Campbell said she will poll all councils in a few weeks' time.

8. TCAB - AD Mechanic Certification

S. Silva provided a summary of hours required to be eligible to challenge the exam across various apprenticeship programs. The proposal to reduce hours in the Amusement Device Mechanics has been well received by Council members.

The current proposal is to change the 3500-hour reduction for Industrial Mechanical Millwrights to an 8000-hour reduction. The reduction in hours would still require a minimum of six months of hands-on experience in the Amusement Ride field, including passport sign-off for TSSACT and Regulation 221/01.

A TCAB will be set up in which C. Clarke and P. Switzer will participate. Other Council members are welcome to join. A. Campbell suggested that J. Tavares would be a good addition.

- S. Silva said the TCAB will be a one-day meeting. Another agenda item for TCAB for limited scope will take more time later on.
- P. Switzer expressed his support for the AD proposal. He noted that the next step will be to look at other apprenticeship programs.
- S. Silva thanked all who helped with the TSSA Amusement Ride training in Oshawa at the beginning of April. He invited suggestions from council for next year's location.
- C. Clarke said Oshawa was a great location and everyone did a great job.

AJ Kadirgamar noted that R. Kremer is retiring next month and thanked him for his long-standing contributions to the TSSA.
